### COST OF CLOTHING—

—YOU FIGURE IT!

The average men's woolen suit weighs four or five pounds and contains that much or less wool. The last sales of wool in the west were at 20 cents a pound and in the middle west at 40 cents. Based upon either class of wool the actual cost of raw material in a man's woolen suit cannot exceed \$2 or \$3. These figures were brought out by the National Wool Committee.

The price of a good woolen suit varies from \$50 to \$75 at present. If this sum of money were spent for raw wool no man could carry on his back the amount of "wool in the grease" that either of these sums would purchase from the farmer direct. Seventy-five dollars invested in wool would perhaps buy 375 pounds.

### RESOLUTION

Whereas there is a movement on foot to have the legislative assembly pass laws raising the salaries of state and county officials, said movement having been inaugurated by the special session in January 1920, Senator Bell chairman of the committee appointed,

Whereas, the cost of living which is urged as a reason for the proposed raise, is now falling, and

Whereas, the farmer whose returns are on an ever descending scale, will be compelled to pay the larger part of any raise, therefore be it

Resolved, that Lincoln County Pomona Grange, goes on record as being opposed to any increase in salaries of public officials at this time, and be it further

Resolved, that the legislative committee of this grange, be, and is, hereby instructed to co-operate with the legislative committee of the state grange, and the committees of subordinate granges, and other farmer's organizations, for the purpose of defeating any legislation at the next session of the legislative assembly of Oregon, the design of which is the raising of salaries of public officials.
