WHO WILL BE THE GOAT?

Answers to protests sent in to the Game Commission against the proposed replacing of our old warden with a new man from the outside, have brought the consoling reply that if this new policy of the Commission does not prove successful, that at some future time they will correct their mistake, and that in the meantime they will be the ones to answer for such mistake.

About as consoling to those of us interested in the welfare of our wild life, as though our physician were to tell us that if some medicine he was trying out on us were to prove fatal, he would promptly change his treatment for his next patient.

The sportsmen and the other citizens of this county will be the goats, not the Game Commission.

It is this fact that has aroused the storm of protest that is coming from all parts of the county, for every one knows from past experience what it means to have a man in charge of the game affairs of this county, who cannot secure and hold the support of the citizens of the county.

The Game Commission might well profit from their experience resulting from the attempted prosecution of those men charged with killing elk in Clatsop county. Wardens from Portland were in charge of the case and made the arrests. The men arrested were caught with a wagon load of elk meat in their possession, also the hide and horns. The warden found "Not Guilty" in a jury trial, and Clatsop county has to foot a big bill of expense. Who is the goat there?

In Clackamas county last month some 30 odd arrests were made by outside game wardens. Trial after trial was held with no convictions, except in one or two instances where the local warden made the arrests. As a result Clackamas also has a long list of court costs to pay. Who is the goat in Clackamas?

We are not upholding the violations above mentioned, but we mention them and their results as an example of what your community is up against where the arresting officers have not the confidence and support of the citizens of that community.

We, of Lincoln County, have been fortunate in having a warden of Mr. Emery's tact and good "horse sense" in handling our game affairs. We are satisfied with him, because he has made good, and because he does not waste the county's money in making frivolous arrests for minor technical offences, that no jury would for a moment consider. By following this sensible policy he has made an enviable record for securing convictions for the more serious violations that have been brought to his attention.

Not so far that the statements of its residents cannot be verified.

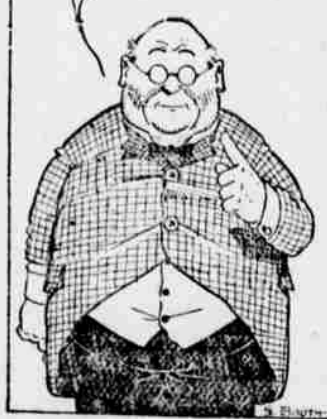
