I notice in the last copy of the Yaquina Bay News an article by Jos. Patterson in which he mentions the status of the timber and other property in Lincoln Co., recently the property of the U. S. and now sold to others on contract. In this regard I talked this year with Maj. H. U. Welch now County Assessor of Multnomah Co., and he stated that he was confronted this year with the same proposition as the Government had sold property in Multnomah Co. to private parties on contract and the buyers had endeavored to escape the tax.

After consulting his own attorneys and the attorneys of the State Tax Commission he found that the property was assessable to the buyers, and offered to turn his information over to the Assessor of this County if it would be of any help. The attorney for the State Tax are of course available to the Assessors of any County at any time they need advice.
