NOTICE OF FILING OF COMMISSIONERS' REPORT

For Lincoln County Drainage District No. 1

Notice is hereby given to all persons interested in the land included within the Lincoln County Drainage District No. 1, Lincoln County, Oregon, the boundary of said district being as follows:

Beginning at that certain point which is the South quarter corner of section 7, township 11 south, range 10 west of Willamette Meridian, in Lincoln County, Oregon; thence west 480 rods, more or less, along the south line of section 7 and section 12 to the southwest corner of section 12, thence north 160 rods to the northwest corner of section 12; thence east 320 rods to the quarter section corner between section 12 and section 7; thence north 80 rods to a point 80 rods south of the northwest corner of section 7; thence east 160 rods to the line running north and south through the center of section 7; thence north 160 rods, more or less, to a point 80 rods south of the center of section 6; thence west 80 rods to the center of the southwest quarter of section 6; thence north 240 rods, more or less, to township line; thence west to the south quarter corner of section 31, township 10, south, range 10 west; thence north 240 rods, more or less, to the center of the north half of section 21 in said township and range, thence east 240 rods, more or less, to a point which is the northeast corner of the southwest one-fourth of the northwest one-fourth of section 22, township 10 south, range 10 west of the Willamette Meridian; thence South 80 rods to a point 80 rods, more or less, west of the center of said section 22; thence west 80 rods, more or less, to the section line between section 31 and section 32; thence south along the east line of the 20-acre tract belonging to O.
