NOTICE OF SCHOOL ELECTION

To Increase Tax More Than Six Per Cent Over That of the Previous Year Notice is hereby given to the legal voters of School District No. 2, of Lincoln County, State of Oregon, that an election will be held in the said District at the Grammar School Bldg. on the 26th day of November, 1921, at 1 o'clock in the afternoon, to vote on the question of increasing the amount of the tax levy in said District for the year 1921 by more than six per cent over the amount of such levy for the year immediately preceding.

It is necessary to raise this additional amount by special levy for the following reasons: The school attendance has grown to the extent that it is necessary to complete the upper floor of the High School Building and employ additional teachers.
