DONT FORGET

In connection with the coming visit of the Oregon cleanup squad of the U. S. Veterans' Bureau to Lincoln county, attention of ex-service men is being directed to the fact that this is the last month in which government insurance can be re-instated. The squad will be in Newport Tuesday Dec. 20 and Toledo Wednesday Dec. 21.

In addition to re-instatements of insurance the squad will handle claims for compensation, vocational training, back pay, travel pay, allotments and Victory medals.
