STATE GRANGE INVITED TO LINCOLN COUNTY

FARMERS' PHONE LINES

The November storm played havoc with every farmer's telephone line that lay in its path. Many of them were utterly prostrated. A few of them, though four weeks have passed have not yet been restored.

Any high wind will damage any country telephone line. When accompanied by rain which turns to ice as it falls, destruction is almost complete. To restore these lines requires labor and material. Both mean so much cash.

Even if no provisions had to be made to repair storm damage, a fund should be provided for upkeep. In common with all other mechanical apparatus a telephone naturally deteriorates, therefore a charge should be made to the users of the utility for the purpose of keeping the system up to a normal efficiency.

Very few of the farmers' lines in Oregon have made such provisions. As a consequence the rehabilitation of the destroyed lines called for fresh capital, and at a time when farmers had little or no money to spare. They should profit by the lesson of the November storm by creating an up-keep fund.

Experience has proved that the least onerous way of creating a reserve is by monthly installments—a regular overhead charge to be paid at the same time as monthly rentals. Authority to do this will, of course, be granted by the Public Service commission.

Whether it be one independent farmer's line or group of lines connected by an exchange, the principle is the same. As it is now, nearly all the farmers' lines are inadequately financed, and it is far better that a reasonable reserve should be systematically created than that the owners of the line should remain in a position where they may be called upon after any violent storm to put up cash to rebuild destroyed property.—Portland Telegram.

SENDING OUT THE WASH

The Erie Railroad has discovered a plan for getting its maintenance of way workmen at the current market prices for labor, without being subjected to artificial wage schedules and rules of employment drawn for special application to railroad employees. The Erie is making contracts with individuals and construction companies to take care of long sections of its roadbed and structures. It is considered the cheapest method of doing the work, and further leases of the sort are under consideration.

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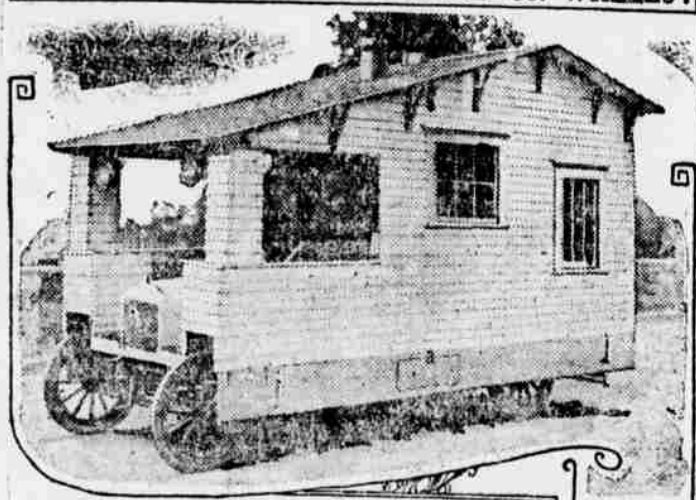
