ANNUAL FARM BUREAU MEETING, TOLEDO, JAN. 26.

Farmers of Lincoln County will be interested in the annual meeting of the Lincoln County Farm Bureau to be held at Toledo, January 26th. This is an especially important meeting, in that on this day the officers will be elected for the year and it is important that the very best possible men be selected, as the directors of the activities of the Bureau and particularly the carrying out of an important program in agriculture will be under their direction. At this meeting also the program to be followed during the year is to be adopted. Since the membership in the Farm Bureau covers a period of three years the program adopted will not be arranged with an idea of getting wonderful results the first year, but a start on a program which has to do with the improvement of the more basic industries is anticipated. For instance, a nurseries sire campaign will be started the object of which will be to eliminate all the grade and scrub sires replacing them with high class purebreds. To accomplish this it will be necessary to organize breed associations in the different classes of livestock and arrange during the next three or four years, possibly for exchanging purebred sires for the grades or scrubs. In livestock disease control it is planned to put into effect a pulling which will require that all cattle coming into the county be both tuberculin and abortion tested. It is planned also to continue the T. B. testing work and to abortion test all the cattle in the county. The value of this project can hardly be estimated. So far as known at the present time there is only one case of contagious abortion in the county, while throughout the United States this disease is causing the largest loss to dairy stock of any disease. Tuberculosis is next. At the present time this county is practically free from both of these diseases but with the putting on of livestock improvement project through which as a natural consequence a great many animals will be imported into the county, unless a special precaution is taken to prevent, this county has been the case with other counties, would soon become badly infected.

CLUB WORK TO BE STARTED
The development of boys' and girls' club work will be started in the county this year. Calf club, pig club, and goat club, has been especially arranged for.

FRUIT AND BERRIES TO RECEIVE ATTENTION
A start on an orchard cleanup campaign is scheduled, and arrangements have been made to have specialists from the College give pruning and spraying demonstrations. The berry industry will be given a stimulation through the development of marketing facilities.

GOATS AND SHEEP INDUSTRY TO BE ASSISTED
As the goat and sheep industry is facing a serious setback because of the ravages of varmits, the Farm Bureau anticipates the encouragement of a coyote club, and the putting on of a systematic campaign to eradicate the varmits. The assistance of the Government hunter and trapper has been arranged for and a systematic educational campaign is bound to bring results.
