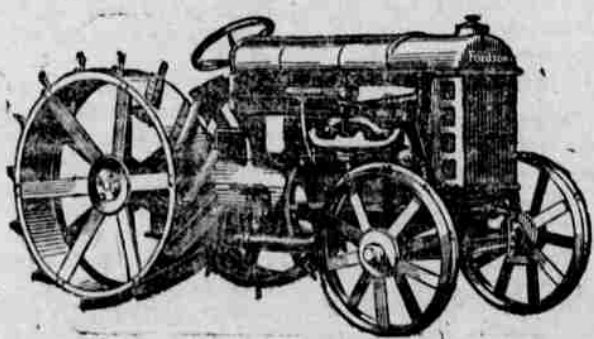

PLANT THE SMOOTH SPUDS

Many of the potatoes with pointed
ends, nobby growths, "bottle necks,"
pinched middles, or that are otherwise
mis-shapen or are very small are af-
fected with wilt. Inspection of fields
for certification have shown these to
be highly undesirable for seed pur-
poses. The experiment station recom-
mends that only smooth potatoes of
marketable size be used for seed. The
planting of diseased seed not only re-
duces the crop but it leaves the disease
in the soil to reduce future crops.—O.
A. C. Experiment Station.
