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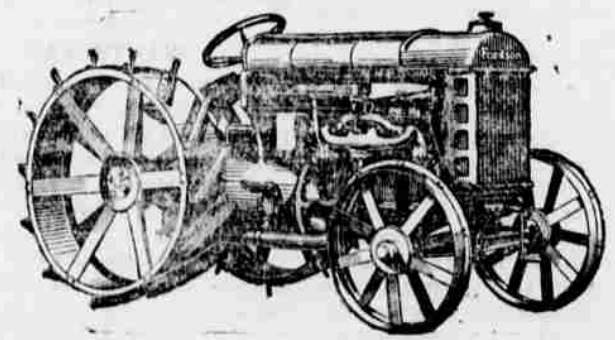

AUDIT OF THE BOOKS OF LINCOLN COUNTY

State of Oregon for the Year 1921 Toledo, Oregon, Mar. 6, 1922. To the Hon. County Court, Lincoln County, Oregon.

Pursuant to your appointment, I have made an audit of the books of the several county officers of Lincoln County, Oregon, who handle county funds, for the year 1921, and report as follows: County Clerk, Carl Gildersleeve, I have filed a separate report covering the office of the County Clerk, under date of March 4, 1922.

As Tax Collector: The Sheriff collected in 1921, carried through her Tax Collection Register, and turned over to the County Treasurer, taxes to the total amount of \$302,123.17.

During the year, the Sheriff turned over taxes collected on the 1920 roll regularly once a month; and make settlement on the delinquent taxes June 30th and Dec. 31st respectively.

In addition to the foregoing, the Sheriff collected the sum of \$1.07 being penalty and interest on 1920 tax receipt No. 4677, which through a clerical error in posting to the Tax Collection Register was not entered thereon and consequently did not get turned over to the County Treasurer.

The Sheriff has been very careful in the matter of writing up her tax records, and the books reflect the work of a very efficient force in the tax office.

Upon payment to the County Treasurer of the item of \$1.07 above set forth, the Sheriff will be entitled to be exonerated on her official bond for the year 1921.

Treasurer, Ira Wade, On Dec. 31, 1920, the County Treasurer had a balance of Cash on hand amounting to \$72,187.65.

During the year he received from all sources, \$467,178.09.

Total receipts and balance at beginning \$539,365.77

His total disbursements during the year, as shown by his books and cancelled vouchers on file; including 1921 Bond Fund money invested in time certificates of deposit, amounted to: \$499,186.37

Balance, Dec. 31, 1921 \$40,179.40 Total \$539,365.77

This balance was carried on deposit in the several banks in Lincoln County, as shown by his balanced pass books as of Dec. 31, 1921. In addition to this balance of \$40,179.40, the County Treasurer had on hand Dec. 31, 1921 the sum of \$60,000.00 in time certificates of deposit, held for the benefit of the 1921 Bond Fund; making the total amount of money in his hands as County Treasurer on Dec. 31, 1921, the sum of \$100,179.40.

REPORT ON AUDIT OF THE BOOKS COUNTY CLERK Lincoln County, Oregon for Year 1921

To the Hon. County Court, Lincoln County, Oregon. Gentlemen:

Pursuant to your appointment, I have audited the books of the County Clerk of Lincoln County, Oregon for the year 1921, and report as follows: County Clerk, Carl Gildersleeve, During the year the County Clerk collected, carried through his fee book and turned over to the County Treasurer promptly, as by law required, fees and miscellaneous items to the amount of \$3,533.60, as follows: January fees \$331.60; February fees \$13.90; March fees \$247.50; Scrap bounty refund 294.00

Fees in addition to the above are due from the County Clerk to the amount of \$15.00, for items which, through error, were not entered in the fee book at the proper time and were not turned over to the County Treasurer. The County Clerk has been handed an itemized statement of these fees, which he has now entered on his fee book to be turned over with the current month's settlement.

All warrants issued were found to be duly authorized. This audit was made from the books of original entry and documentary evidence on file in the office of the County Clerk, and except as hereinbefore stated, I find the Clerk's books correct with all money coming to his hands properly accounted for. Where errors were found, not involving shortages or overpayment of money, the attention of the Clerk has been called thereto and the error corrected.

When he has paid over the \$15.00 above mentioned, the County Clerk will be entitled to be exonerated under his official bond for the year 1921. I am submitting this separate report on the County Clerk because I am informed that the Court particularly desired a report on this office at the March term. The volume of work in making the audit on the other offices is such that it will not be possible to file the report on them before Court has adjourned. The work, however, will go forward as rapidly as possible and the report will be filed at the earliest possible moment.
