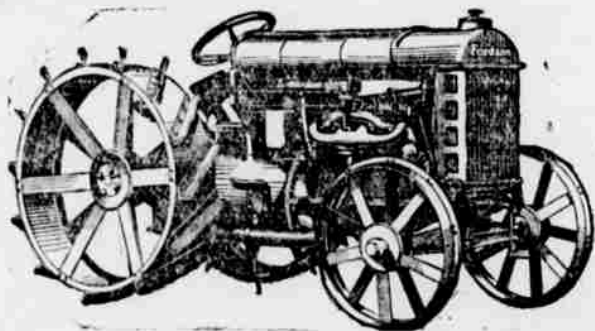

Because of the fact that Mr. Brown of O. A. C. was principal speaker of the day, dinner was served early in order that Mr. Brown could take the outgoing train. The dinner needs no comment as all grangers who have visited with the Elk City grange are aware of its good qualities.

After dinner the Grange was opened in the fifth degree but was closed in this degree shortly and opened in the fourth to allow all grangers the opportunity to take part in the business program.

ORDINANCE NO.

An Ordinance to license, tax and regulate certain businesses, trades, callings and employments carried on for gain in the City of Toledo, Oregon; regulating the manner of issuing licenses, the license fees therefor, providing for the disposition of moneys collected hereunder, providing the manner of enforcement and for penalties hereunder, and repealing all ordinances in conflict herewith and

declaring an emergency. Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the City of Toledo:

Section 1.—No person, firm, company or corporation shall in any manner engage in, prosecute or carry on for gain within the limits of the City of Toledo, any business, trade, calling or employment for which a license is required by this Ordinance, without first having obtained such license as herein provided.

Section 2.—Every person, firm, company or corporation required by this Ordinance to obtain a license shall pay to the City Recorder of the City of Toledo, the sum herein specified to be paid therefor, and the City Recorder upon the payment of said sum shall issue a license to the person, firm, company or corporation applying therefor, in accordance herewith.

Section 3.—In any case in which more than one business, trade, calling or employment for which a license is required under this Ordinance, shall be prosecuted or carried on by the person, firm, company or corporation, a license must be taken out for each of such businesses, trades, callings or employments.

Section 4.—The following license fees set opposite the respective businesses, trades, callings or employments hereinafter enumerated, shall be paid annually, except as herein otherwise provided, by each person, firm, company or corporation engaged in prosecuting or carrying on for gain such respective business, trade, calling or employment, to-wit:

Section 5.—Any person, firm, company or corporation which shall procure a license hereunder and shall sell the business for which the same was issued, cannot transfer such license to the purchaser of such business, but shall make application therefore to the City Council for the issuance of a new license for the unexpired portion thereof.

Section 6.—All Ordinances in parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith, or any part thereof, are hereby repealed, provided, however, that nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed to interfere with, or affect any license heretofore issued to any person, firm, company or corporation, to carry on any business, trade, calling or employment in the City of Toledo, but the same shall remain in full force and effect until the expiration thereof, by the terms of such license.

Section 7.—Should any part, provision or section of this Act be invalid for any reason, it is hereby expressly provided that all other parts, provisions and sections hereof shall not be deemed to be affected thereby, nor the validity impaired.

Section 8.—All license fees and moneys derived under and by virtue of this Ordinance, shall be deposited by the City Treasurer in and as a part of the general fund of the said City of Toledo.

Section 9.—Any person, firm, company or corporation who shall within the limits of the said City of Toledo, engage in prosecute or carry on any business, trade, calling or employment, for gain, for which a license is required by this Ordinance, without first obtaining a license as herein provided, or who shall in any manner fail to comply with the requirements of this Ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a violation hereof, and upon conviction in the City Recorder's Court of the City of Toledo, shall be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$50.00, for each violation hereof, in default of payment of which fine he or she shall be confined in the city jail for a period of one day of each \$2.00 of such fine.

Section 10.—It is hereby adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this act is necessary

for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the City of Toledo, and an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance take effect and be in full force and effect, from and after its due passage by the Common Council of the City of Toledo and its approval by the Mayor of said City.
