Section 1.
That Fourth street between the intersection thereof with Graham street and the intersection thereof with Stanton street, be improved as follows: by grading said street to the full width thereof in conformance with the official grade and elevation thereof heretofore adopted by the city council, a map and plat of which is now on file in the office of the city recorder.

Section 2.
That said portion of Fourth street be planked 16 feet wide in the center thereof, with 3-inch planking, 16 feet long, 6 inches wide, spaced with 1-inch block at center and ends of stringer, to be securely nailed on five stringers laid lengthwise in the said street, said stringers to be at least 3 inches thick and 6 inches wide, dirt to be filled in level with top of the stringer and the said plank to be nailed thereto with 60-penny spikes, two spikes to be used in the ends of plank where they rest on the outside stringers, placed on the upper edge of each outside center stringer and one spike where each plank crosses an inside stringer and on the bottom edge of the center stringer.

Section 4.
That the owners of the property liable for said improvement shall have the option of making said improvement in lieu of paying said assessment, and that should any of said property owners elect to make such improvement, they shall notify the recorder of the city of Toledo, Oregon, within 15 days from the date of the passage of this ordinance, of the intention to make said improvement, which notice shall be in writing and signed by the owner of the property liable for such improvement, and shall commence said work within 30 days and complete the same within fifty days after passage of this ordinance, said work to be done under the supervision and direction of the street commissioner of the City of Toledo.

Section 5.
That upon the expiration of thirty days after the passage of this ordinance, the city recorder of the City of Toledo shall advertise for the making of said improvement, the planking and grading of said street, or of so much thereof as the property owners shall not have begun said improvement, which said advertisement shall be in some newspaper published in the City of Toledo, for two successive issues thereof.

Section 6.
The city recorder of the City of Toledo, is hereby directed to enter into the docket of City Liens, a statement of said assessment as set forth in section 3 of this ordinance, giving the number of the lot assessed, the name or number of the block, the name of the addition in which the lot is situated, the name of the owner of such property, the sum assessed upon each lot, part of lot or parcel of ground, and the date of the entry of said liens.
