

OREGON JERSEY BOOSTERS TO INSPECT FAMOUS HERD

One of America's Leading Breeders Will Show Some Contributions to State's Leadership.

The Ashburn herd is now under the management of C. C. Dickson whose name stands at the head of American Jersey breeders in the 1921 honor list for Jerseys, with seven medal cows to his credit.

To get into the gold medal class a cow registered in the American Jersey Cattle club must produce in one year not less than 700 pounds butterfat—enough to make approximately 850 pounds of commercial butter—and carry a calf for not less than 165 days of the year.

This herd has a gold medal bull, Valentine's Ashburn Baronet, a distinction awarded on the performance of his daughters, which make the

medal cow rank. This herd has also a silver medal bull, St. Mawes of Ashburn, and is the only herd in America having both gold and silver medal bulls.

UNITED STATES A NATION OF PRODUCING CITIZENS

Bureau of Census Figures Show Proportion in Various Labors.

Washington, May 11, (Capital News Service).—The Bureau of the Census compiles volume after volume of figures from which the statistician draws many inferences.

Male workers engage in agriculture to the number of 29.9 per cent (9,867,000 men). Three and three-tenths per cent do mining (1,087,000 workers). Thirty-two and nine-tenths per cent manufacture (10,892,000 laborers), while 8.6 per cent (2,852,000 men) are engaged in transportation.

Women are 12.7 per cent in agriculture (1,084,000 dairymaids and farmettes), 22.6 per cent in manufacturing (1,931,000 machine tenders and skilled workers).

COL. WHITE BOOSTS ROOSEVELT HIGHWAY

In brief Colonel White's platform is as follows: Less state expenditure; consolidation of commissions; immediate plans for retiring state's indebtedness; control Japanese ownership of land; stimulate progress in Oregon.

Colonel White has nothing in his published platform definitely concerning the Roosevelt highway, but he confided his ambitions for this project in the ear of a reporter later.

"I've traveled over nearly all the coast country from the Columbia river to the California line," said Colonel White, "and I've never seen a country so rich in natural resources any place else. The Roosevelt highway would open the vast amount of undeveloped country to the world."

"There is another aspect of the situation that also interests me. That is the valuable aid such a highway would give to the military preparedness program of the government," continued the Colonel.—Tillamook Headlight. (Pd. Adv.)
