DROUGHT STRICKEN BEING RELIEVED

WASHINGTON, Mar 19. Of the \$1,500,000 appropriated by the Congress for the relief of farmers in drought-stricken areas of the Northwest, \$1,067,766 had been loaned up to May 7, to 8,688 farmers. The relief is provided for farmers in the "crop failure" district comprising the two states of North Dakota and Montana and certain sections of South Dakota, Idaho and Washington. In these districts owing to four consecutive years of drought there have been no crops whatever, and hence no seed is available for planting new crops this year. The appropriation is for the purpose of purchasing grain for seeding this spring, such seeding to be limited to wheat, oats, barley and flax.

COYOTES FALL BEFORE WOMAN'S EAGLE EYE

OLYMPIA, Wash., The first woman predatory animal hunter to be employed by the federal bureau of biological survey in this state is Mrs. George T. Rose of Deep Creek, Spokane county, who already has ten coyote pelts to her credit. The greatest prize is "three foot," a coyote who lost an paw in a trap several years ago and has been a menace in that section of the country for the past 15 years.

George T. Rose, who is the regularly employed hunter in the Deep Creek country dislocated an elbow recently and his wife immediately took his place. She was placed on the federal payroll today by Glenn R. Bach, predatory animal inspector.
