Labor Appropriations More For 1923 Than For 1922; Gompers Attacks Unfounded.

"Sure he belongs to the union. I guess I ought to know 'cause I wanted to find out how to join myself some of these days," was Jack's comment as Uncle Ted entered the garage where Ruth and Jack were talking.

"I didn't think he did," answered Ruth.

"Freddie's father does belong to the union. That's all right. There's no harm in that. The unions are fine things 'cause Uncle Ted says so, but they've got some men in them who are NOT so fine."

"Guess you're right, Jack," spoke up Uncle Ted from the other side of the car where he had not been seen by the children.

"When did you come out here?" asked Ruth.

"Just a minute ago," answered Uncle Ted, "to see what you were up to. It's getting dark and bed-time, so come along. You've made me think of a story I've wanted to tell and now I'm going to tell it."

"Apparently, Jack, you were talking about the attitude taken recently by the American Federation of Labor and its President, Samuel Gompers, when that body met in Cincinnati. There is no doubt that the Federation is controlled by Democratic officials led by Mr. Gompers. They have indulged in the grossest misrepresentation of the efforts of the present Republican administration. They have proved that the American Federation of Labor is not led by men devoted to the problems of the honest and industrious majority of laboring men. It is controlled by a few officials who are using it to spread malicious charges against the Republican party. It doesn't take much effort to remember how Samuel Gompers used to camp on the doorstep of the White House and attend official functions at the right hand of Woodrow Wilson. He was practically an official of the administration when the Democrats were in control. Now HE IS ON THE OUTSIDE LOOKING IN. If he and the other officials of the organization looked after the interests of the men who belong to it they would have no time to indulge in unfounded attacks upon the work of the administration.

"Their attack against the manner in which the budget system has been handled at Washington is without foundation. The appropriation bills passed by the Congress now in session provide more for the Department of Labor for the year beginning July 1 than for the present year. The total amount of money spent by the Department of Labor for 1922 stands at \$5,454,836. The amount voted by the present Congress and agreed to by President Harding under the budget system for the Department of labor for 1923 is \$6,916,920. This shows that the amount of money provided by the budget system for the Department stands at \$1,462,085 more than the amount provided without the budget for the year ending June 30.

"In other words, the appropriations for the Labor Department under the budget are 27 per cent higher than they were for the preceding year. The fact is that the Federation had no reason for making such charges as were indulged in at Cincinnati. The Republican party is strong enough to weather them. But the part of it that makes me and any other real citizen mad is that the attacks are really at the government. Mr. Gompers and his associates have also attacked the Supreme Court of the United States. He wants his listeners and readers to believe that because a former Republican President is Chief Justice, and because a Republican administration is now in control of the government, the decision recently handed down declaring the child labor law unconstitutional was a Republican move.

Mr. Gompers also bitterly attacked the Railroad Labor Board the minute the board functioned in opposition to his views. When the Board decides his way it is all right, but when that Board announced a cut in wages to conform with new price adjustments, he issued a statement to the effect that prices are not only not lower than in 1920, but lots of things are higher. The Department of Labor shows that foods and most commodities cost at least one-third less than in the summer of 1920."
