HORRIBLE CONFLAGRATION AT TIENSIN.

NEARLY THREE THOUSAND CHINESE BURNED TO DEATH.

(From the Hong Kong Mail.)

At Tientsin, on the 7th off January, a terrible calamity occurred. A fire broke out at 10 o'clock in the morning, at one of the relief yards established outside of the city wall for the benefit of the famine refugees. A strong northeast wind was blowing at the time, and scarcely an hour passed before the sheds were burned, and between 2,800 and 3,000 women and children were suffocated or burned to death.
