> MILTON. IMPORTANT LAND DECISION.

Washington, April 29.—The secretary of the interior has just rendered an important decision in the case of Sullivan et al. vs Walter Omera et al. involving title to certain lands form erly within the limits of the Stockton and Copperopolis railroad grant, and establishing a precedent which supstantially decides forty or fifty similar cases now before the department, on appeal from various parts of California. This railroad grant was declared forfeited by congress in June, 1874, and the lands were restored to pre-emption and homestead entry September 4th Prior to September 4th the parties ex ecuted declaratory atatements dated ahead and alleging settlement as of September 4th, and left these papers with the register of the land office to be filed on that day. They procured lumber and teams and started for the lands, arriving there at sunrise, and conmenced to build houses before 12 o'clock, noon. The general land office, in successive decisions, held these filings valid. Secratary Schurz now reverses these decisions. He holds that the declaratory statements were execu ted before settlement; that the executive order of restoration prohibited the local office from allowing any filings on entries prior to the day of restoration, and that its action in receiving declaratory statements prior to that time, and afterwards placing them on record, was contrary not only to the spirit and intent of instructions, but to the just and proper administration of the law of congress. Schurz emphasizes his

These officers have no authority to receive applications to file or enter lands which are in the seat of the reservation, and hold such filings until the reservation is removed, and then place them on record in order to advance the interests of any individual. Such an act of favoritism is contrary to the proper administration of the public land system and cannot receive the sanction of the department.

THE EASTERN PUZZLE.

The Oriental riddle over which European diplomats are now racking their brains is apparently no nearer a solution than it was at the end of hostilities between Russia and Turkey. The news transmitted by cuble is so conflicting as to make it utterly impossible to form a clear opinion on the subject. The English and Russian press evidently place no confidence in the reported arul of the land and naval forces around Constantinople, and the expression of hope that the Congress will yet meet comes from Vienna. The chief diffi culty in the way of an agreement seems to be the locality to which each Power is to retire, and it cannot be denied that with the fleet at Besika Bay, England would have the advantage of Russis in a possible race race for the Bosporus, should the Grand Dake's troops retire to Adrianople. - S. F. Chronicle.

Ten thousand head are for Lang & Ryan, and six thousand for Edwards & Edenbarter. These men have been buying up all the beef stock they could secure in the past six months, and the drove they take out this time will beat anything in that line ever seen on the North Pacific Coast. - Standard.
