About 1 o'clock on the morning of the 15th inst. there was perpetrated in front of Chancey's hotel in our town one of the most cowardly attempts to ceipt of price, or by express, C. O. D. Address, commit a double murder, that ever darkened the criminal records of the Pacific Coast. The facts as pear as can gather them are about as follows; John P. Sallivan and wife were returning home from a party given at the Centennial hotel, in company with Mrs Having purchased the Barber Shop on Sullivan's mother. In front of Chancey's hotel they passed A. T. Weddle, who, without giving them any warning drew a revolver and placing it against Mrs. Sullivan, fired, inflicting a deep wound on the right side of the spine just below the shoulder blade. At the report of the pistol Mrs. Sullivan fell, and before Mr. Sullivan could turn fairly around he too was shot, the ball striking him on the left side of the lower abdomen and ranging from left to right. Though stunned by the wound, Sullivan with characteristic grit turned upon the would be murder. er, and, first striking him with his fist, he gathered up some stones and chased the scoundrel half way across the street before he fell. They were both immediately taken and carried home. Drs. Cromwell and Drake were immediately summoned and proceeded to examine the wounds, which, unfortunately, were of such a nature as to prevent their finding the balls by probing. The wounds are considered very dangerous, and at the present writing the appearences are that both will be fatal. Mrs. Sullivan appears to suffer the most, the right leg being paralyzed. Weddle, after doing the shooting, ran around by back streets, and went directly to the sheriff's residence and gave h imself up, saying, as he gave up the pistol: "Here, take this, and turn the key on me tonight. Do what you please with me; hang General Merchandise, me if you want to." In response to the sheriff's query if he had used it, he said. "Yes, I've used it; you will find out in the morning what I have done.' The only motive for the deed appears Boots and Shoes Hats and Caps seems that previous to Mrs. Sullivan's first marriage, Weddle sought her hand in marriage, but was refused. After the death of Dr. Baker, he renewed the attentions but was persistently refused. At this he took umbrage and swore he would send her to the boneyard,' and since her second marriage, he has repeated the threat a dozen times to Mr Bad Chapman and others. His threats were so often and of such dangerous goods. character, that he was arrested a few months since and examined as to his sanity, but was discharged. To show the more planly his intent in the matter, a short time previous to the shoot ing, he went to the office of the Centennial hotel and asked Bud Chapman if Mr. and Mrs. Sullivan were at the party. Being informed that they were, be said he guessed that he would go up awhile. Not having a ticket he was refused admissian and came back, replying to Mr Chapman's banter that he did not dance long: "There's too

many there for my dance." Mr. and Mrs. Sallivan are both well known in our county. Mr. Sullivan Something New! Since writing the above, Mr. Sallilivan died about 11:30 o'clock, and a coroner's jury is now investigating the case with Mr. E S.McComas presiding as justice of the peace. Mrs. Sullivan is very low, with no hopes of her recovery. The probabilities now are that they will both be buried in the same grave.
