On the 29th ult., a bill to restrict Chinese immigration was passed by the House of reprensentatives by a vote of 155 to 72. and it is thought it will be put through the Senate without delay; The bill provides that no more than fifteen Chinese may be brought to the United States by any one vessel. This is very far from an enforcement of the cry of Kearny that, "the Chinese must go," but if it be strictly enforced there is no doubt that the number of Chinese in the country will be the Flowery Kingdom every year, and although some of them might be induced to prolong their stay somewhat in consequence of the increase of wages and the decrease of the pressure against them which will doubtless result, yet the number leaving will still greatly exceed that of those coming in, and a depletion of that portion of our population will gradually, but surely be effected.
