OUTBREAK OF UTE INDIANS IN COLORADO.

Again the wires are flashing over the country the news of an unexpected and disastrous attack by Indians upon U. S. troops, and it is not impossible that subsequent dispatches may tell of another massacre like that of Custer and his command. This time it is the Ute Indians in Colorado who are upon the war path, and they are said to be ferocious and dangerous warriors.

Various theories are given as to the cause of the outbreak, but it is generally supposed to be owing chiefly to the failure of the government to pay the \$79,000 due under the Brunat treaty of 1873, by which the San Juan mining region was ceded by the Utes to Colorado.

The grand ovation given to Grant at San Francisco was apparently entirely free from political feeling or purpose, eminent men of all parties joining heartily in the reception.

The work of grading on the Northern Pacific Railroad was begun on the 21st inst. at Ainsworth, the new town on the Columbia, at the mouth of Snake river.

FOR THE PURPOSE OF FOUNDING THE ASHLAND COLLEGE AND NORMAL SCHOOL the Ashland Academy property has been placed, free from debt, under the control of a Board of Trustees, who have inaugurated the enterprise by selling the following positions in the FACULTY:

REV. LOWELL L. ROGERS, A. M., President. W. F. NICHOLS, A. M., Vice President. Professor of Mental and Physical Science. MR. A. A. ROGERS, Professor, Teacher of English Grammar, etc.

OTHER competent instructors will be recruited as fast as the needs of the Institution require. For the purpose of procuring with the best facilities for commencing a course of study:

1. CLASSICAL, including Greek, Latin, and French. 2. SCIENTIFIC, including Mathematics, Natural Philosophy, and Chemistry. 3. NORMAL, COVING THE TEACHERS OF SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES.

1. The College will be chartered, and the Normal or Training school for teachers will be made, it is hoped by special enactment, an adjunct of the Public School system, and diplomas made equivalent to first grade certificates.

2. Ashland has no saloons. The sale of intoxicating liquors is prohibited by the city authorities, who are sustained by a strong public sentiment.

3. The school will be under the supervision of an Evangelical Christian Church. The Bible will be reverently read and studied, the working of God encouraged, but the institution will be sectarian in no other sense.

4. Book keeping, business arithmetic, English composition and other branches specially preparatory for business life, will receive unusual attention.

5. The preceptress will give her chief attention to the care and oversight of the young ladies.

6. An endorsement of 2000 will be, these is reason to hope, promptly subscribed, enabling the Trustees to reduce the present status of tuition, specially to teachers, after the present year.
