A REVOLUTION IN TEACHING.

The New York Tribune tells of a revolution in the methods of education in the primary schools of Quincy, Mass., which has produced results eminently satisfactory and developed a system of elementary school training greatly superior to the "cramping, veneering" system common in American schools.

The U. S. Supreme Court has decided as constitutional the Thurman Act, which requires the Central Pacific railroad company to set aside a portion of its earnings every year as a sinking fund to meet its enormous liabilities of \$116,000,000 falling due in less than twenty years.

J. J. Whitney, Prosecuting Attorney for the Third Judicial District of Oregon, has refused to prosecute cases against certain of the ex-state officials against whom charges of corruption and speculation were preferred by the Investigating Committee.

The complete official returns of the vote in Ohio show that Foster beat Ewing by 17,129 votes, and had a clear majority over the three other tickets in the field.

The women and children of the White River Agency, held as prisoners by the Utes, have been surrendered to Special Agent Adams.

The total vote cast in the state of California at the late election was 161,405. The vote against Chinese Immigration was 154,639 and in favor 883.

There is said to be a growing sentiment at the South in favor of General Hancock as the Democratic nominee for President.

The yellow fever epidemic at Memphis has been officially declared ended, and people are returning to the city.

Under a recent ruling of the postoffice department, all mail matter directed to any place not a regular postoffice will be sent directly to the dead letter office, unless directions on the wrapper enable the postmaster to return it to the sender.
