SHARON AS A PATRIOT.

Senator Sharon, who owns one of the Nevada Senatorships, is reported as giving expression in a recent interview with a reporter to his theory that the government of this country should be controlled exclusively by the wealthy classes, and citizens who can not count their thousands be deprived of all power or voice in public matters. He declared it as his belief that this condition of affairs must come to pass sooner or later, and that politicians might as well overcome their squeamishness in the matter at once.

A Washington special says: The House Committee on Appropriations has received a letter from the Postmaster-General, transmitting one from Assistant Postmaster-General Brady, in regard to star service, which shows that this branch of the service is now costing at the rate of \$1,725,000 above the appropriation.

Senator Windom, of Minnesota, has introduced a resolution instructing the Appropriations Committee to inquire into the expediency of establishing a new Executive Department, to have charge of all matters relating to agriculture, commerce, mines, manufactures and public lands, and to be known as "The Department of Agriculture and Commerce."

SUPREME COURT DEFENDED.

The Benton County Blade (Democratic) takes the Salem Mercury to task for attacking the two Democratic Judges of the Supreme Court, and ably defends the Judges against charges of bribery.

As the Mercury says: "P. M. has been known for the last twenty years" and Mr. Cornell knows, from his residence in Southern Oregon, that although the Judge has lived, during that time in the most frugal manner and has had a small family to maintain, yet he possesses little or nothing besides his modest home in Jacksonville.

The same that has been said concerning Judge Prim may be repeated as to Judge Kelly. He served six years in the United States Senate during (as the Mercury has asserted and must now admit) a most venal and corrupt period, and it is hardly probable that he would return to Oregon to make a competency by accepting bribes on the bench.

Ben Butler denies that he has given any legal advice in the Maine muddle, and says he has had nothing to do with the matter whatever. It is a surprise to New Englanders to learn that a muss has occurred in that section without Butler having a hand in it.

During the year 1879, 823 decrees of divorce were ordered by the District Courts of San Francisco. Of this number 63 were in favor of husbands and 260 of wives.

Parnell, the Irish agitator, was received at Madison Square Garden, New York City, on the 4th by about eight thousand persons. He made an eloquent speech, describing the present distress in Ireland and pointing out the certainty of its repetition under the present system of land laws.

At the time for convening the Maine legislature, the morning of the 9th, The fusion members and two Republican members took their seats in the Senate, but not a single Republican appeared in the hall of the House. The usual committees were appointed to canvass votes for members etc; and a sensation was created by two Fusionists stating that they had been approached and offered \$1,000 each to resign their seats.

"Emperor Norton," the fantastic character, well known to all who are acquainted with San Francisco life, died suddenly on the street in that city on Thursday of last week. His real name was Joshua A. Norton. He reached San Francisco in '49, and engaged in extensive mercantile operations for several years, when he was reduced to bankruptcy. In 1857 he became possessed by the idea that he was Emperor of the United States, and since then has worn a sword and plume, and has been a prominent feature of street curiosities in San Francisco.

In a "blue book" kept for that purpose by the Postmaster-General, there is enrolled each day the name of one or more lottery dealers who cannot use the mails as a medium of swindling the people. This official deserves thanks of the public for the thorough manner in which he is pursuing these vultures and it is to be hoped that he will be sustained by the courts.
