Broken Promises.
(One go to or Ocean.)
The facts elicited by the Senate com-
mittee as to the Cheyenne outbreak, re-
ported in our special, go to disclose how
the Indian troubles are brought about by
the system of large promises and utter
failure in performance, which would
seem to constitute the entire policy in
dealing with them. They were told they
would be removed to a region abounding
with game. They were removed to In-
dian Territory, where they found no
game. They were to be provided with
medicine and medical attendance. The
messes became epidemic among them
and killed twelve per cent of their en-
tire number; and, while it raged with
terrible severity, they were not provided
with medicine, and one doctor was left
to attend several thousand of them.
During the epidemic he did not attend
them because he had no medicines. The
amnesty goods, which it was specified in
the treaty they were to receive, were
never delivered. Another of the prom-
ises upon which they consented to be re-
moved to the Indian Territory was that
cattle should be furnished them. But
no cattle were ever furnished. And
without these, without amnesty supplies,
and in a region destitute of game, the ra-
tions issued them for a week's food were
not sufficient for two days. The whole
incident how, at government expense,
Indian wars are stirred up.

Francis M. Morris, of New York,
testified before the Congressional
Inter-occenic Canal committee that
the right of way over the Nicara-
gua route was granted to him by
the Nicaragua government. He
claims to have been one of the pi-
oneers in the canal movement and
the originator of the Nicaragua
route. The position taken by
Morris and his claims in this re-
gard become exceedingly interest-
ing, in view of the rumored threats
of foreign powers to support De
Lesseps' scheme despite the Mon-
roe doctrine. If Morris is pos-
sessed of the right of way over the
Nicaragua route, the United States
may acquire a protectorate over
the same.
Great and increasing distress is
reported from Ireland. Three
cases of death from starvation near
Parsonstown, County of Louth, are
reported. The Pope has sent 10,
000 francs from Rome to be ap-
plied in alleviating the distress.
In some districts the distress has
almost taken the character of a
famine, and the gravest fears are
entertained for the spring and early
summer. Advice indicate that
the destitution in Connaught and
the Northwest and Southwest and
the islands lying off these parts
exceeds the worst apprehensions of
the people. The movement for
raising relief funds is active in most
of the large cities of the United
States, and much assistance will
be given by the people of this
country.
The Supreme Court, now in
session at Salem, has decided in
the case of Mary J. Atteberry vs.
Thomas T. Atteberry, an appeal
case from Douglas county, that
under the law as it now exists in
this state, the wife is entitled to
hold any property acquired by the
proceeds of her own personal
labor, and that the husband has no
right to compel her to turn it over
to him.
The Republicans of California
are raising a row in relation to the
appointment of John M. Morton,
son of the late Senator from Indi-
ana, to the office of Collector of
Federal Revenue at San Francis-
co. Hayes says he will stand by
the appointment, while the Re-
publican delegation from this
coast are using every effort to pre-
vent Morton's confirmation by the
Senate.

A Washington dispatch says
that the House committee on Inval-
id Pensions has unanimously
agreed to report the following re-
solution: "That all pension claims
of an invalid character shall be re-
ported to date from discharge,
where disability was incurred pre-
viously to discharge; and where dis-
ability was incurred subsequent to
discharge, from date of disability;
and all gratuitous pensions shall
date from the passage of this Act.
All widow's pensions, where a
husband had been a pensioner, shall
date from the death of the husband,
and where the husband had not
been a pensioner, from the date of
disability."
The committee appointed by
Congress to investigate the causes
of the Negro exodus has discovered
that so far as any covert attempt
to influence the negroes to emi-
grate is concerned it is chargeable
to the railroad companies interest-
ed in the travel, instead of to any
political organization. One wit-
ness said he believed the Balti-
more & Ohio Railroad Company,
through its agents, was furnishing
money to pay the negro speakers,
Perry, Williams and Evans, who
are engaged in stirring up the peo-
ple to emigrate from North Caro-
lina.
