The following interesting letter from Congressman Hermann concerning the proposed Crater Lake national park was received by W. G. Steel, of Portland, last week.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 22, '86. MY DEAR MR. STEEL:-I have just returned from the executive mansion, where the President gave me an audience and after the manner of a private conference made me acquainted with the importance of the proposed reservation, and suggested the advisability of withdrawing the ten townships embraced in Crater and Diamond lakes by Executive order, and proclamation from future sale and disposal. I take this course as a precaution so as to avoid the opportunity to speculators or others to take up and hold the desirable portions of a park reservation or its future great value.

Major J. W. Powell, the eminent geologist and the head of the geological and geodetic divisions of the Government, has suggested that geologists and reports on the geological surveys of the nation are so celebrated and so eagerly sought for, accompanied me to the President and accompanied in what I had to remark as to the wonderful scene, as well as physical features of the proposed park.
