The decision of the supreme court in the registry law case came rather late, but is received with satisfaction, nevertheless. The law did not meet with general favor. By many it was considered a needless expense to the state, and the limited time given in which to register, as well as the requirement of personal appearance of voters before the registration board, would have caused much inconvenience and dissatisfaction.

One of the district judges of lowa has been impeached by the legislature for refusing to mantain the prohibitory laws in his decisions. The Iowa temperance people are not content with the mere enactment of prohibitory legislation. They are earnest enough to want it enforced, and evidently mean to give it a thorough test. Many of the leading and strongest newspapers in the state are uncompromising in their support of prohibition.

The next killing frost on county candidates is due about the 17th, and will blight many a blossoming hope: another will occur on the 24th and kill off a large portion of the numerous buds of aspiration in the Democratic garden, and in the early part of June, when the roses are blooming in their glory and beauty and the fragrant air is mild and balmy beneath the summer sun, the cruelest frost of all will come, and kill just about twothirds of all the crop that weathered the tutionality of the law regarding the rerude blasts of the convention days.

Both the Republican and Democratic papers in Douglas county have offended some of the "thick-and-thin" members of their respective parties by giving aid and encouragement to the Prohibition movement. A large Prohibition vote will be polled in Douglas at the coming election, and it is not impossible that some of the candidates on the county ticket may be elected. REGISTRY LAW KILLED.

On Wednesday morning last the Orcgon Supreme Court reached a decision in the case brought to test the constigistration of voters. The law was held by the court to be unconstitutional and invalid, and all proceedings in pursuance of its provisions are therefore at an end. The state has already been at considerably expense in preparing books, etc., for the registration which was to have been made next week, and it is a matter for regret that the case was not brought to the attention of the supreme court and passed upon before anything had been done to incur this needless action to the outlay of the state government.

The report of the decision was received here by telegram, and no further information as to the treatment of the case by the court has been obtained yet.
