NOT ANY FREE TRADE FOR OREGON.

Telegraph it to St. Louis!

The most sanguine Republican in Oregon was surprised by the great victory of last Monday. It is the greatest ever known in the history of the state, and the majority is so heavy that the Democrats are completely overwhelmed with disappointment and haven't even the heart to explain "how it was done." They began hedging a few days before the election and telegraphed from Washington the cue of explanation in case of defeat. It was to be "Herrmann's personal popularity," but this explanation couldn't possibly be stretched to cover the figures reached, and Herrmann's personal popularity wouldn't give Lord six or seven thousand majority. So there can be no escape from the acknowledgment that Cleveland did it with his free trade message, and his Mill's bill with its free wool and protected sugar.

No such majorities have ever been reached in Oregon before. In Multnomah, where Garin's "personal popularity" was to carry the day for him, Herrmann has 3000 majority, and in the whole state the latest estimates give him 7000.

The legislature, which Col. Irish predicted would have a Democratic majority of five, is so heavily Republican that the Oregonian is already complaining of it, as something of a benefit to the party and the state. Estimates at Republican headquarters give the Republicans seventy and the Democrats twenty members—a heavy majority in each house. This means that Oregon will not elect a Democratic senator to succeed Dolph. Oregon may not be as great a state as New York or California, but she has made it understood that she must not be expected to believe every stranger who comes in to tell her that she wants free trade, or enforced tutelage from the White House.

Oregon has "fired the first gun." It was heard in St. Louis. Its echo will reverberate throughout the nation; it will be answered by a salute of twenty-five guns on the 6th of November, and they will all be loaded with the same kind of majorities.

JACKSON COUNTY. Jackson, the banner Democratic county of the state, joins in the general repudiation of Cleveland's free trade dogmas and his interference with our state affairs, by cutting down its majority for Congressmen to half what it was two years ago—Garin receiving only 194 votes more than Herrmann. The choice of Garin over Herrmann is the important office of clerk, sheriff, commissioner and surveyor shows that the Democrats have independence and sagacity enough to do their own voting, and that qualification for office is not to be entirely lost sight of behind partisan bias. The voters of Jackson county are to be congratulated upon their judgment and good sense in this respect. We give the full official vote of the county on another page. It shows the election of the three Democratic representatives, one of them by a very small majority; one Democratic commissioner, treasurer, county judge, assessor, school superintendent and coroner. The Republicans elect clerk, sheriff, one commissioner and surveyor.

MULTNOMAH COUNTY. Multnomah elects its entire county and legislative ticket by heavy majority. Herrmann's majority will reach 3000, and Lord's about the same. This is where our Democratic friends told us Herrmann was to be slaughtered by his party.

JOSEPHINE COUNTY. Josephine county gives a majority of 744 for Garin and elected C. K. Chaslor, clerk; T. G. Patterson, sheriff; J. A. Jennings, treasurer; P. C. Bean, assessor; W. N. Saunders, surveyor, and W. H. Flaunigan, coroner—all Democrats—and one Democratic commissioner. Charles Howard, representative; one commissioner and school superintendent were elected by the Republicans.

CLATSOP COUNTY. The full count in Klamath county shows four Republicans and three Democrats elected to county offices. The following are the majority except for commissioners and coroner: Republican—Moore, county judge, 109; Leavitt, county clerk, 23; Kester, commissioner, elected, majority not given. Democratic—Childers, sheriff, 49; Burnett, 75; Cogswell, joint assessor, 72; Moss, joint representative 64.

DOUGLAS COUNTY. Douglas elects a solid Republican ticket except Hamilton, Democrat, for prosecuting attorney has a majority in the county. Herrmann's majority will be about 300.

LANE COUNTY. Lane county comes into line with a Republican majority of over two

A recent Washington dispatch says: The committee on appropriations has agreed to insert in the appropriation bill provisions, asked for by Representative Herrmann, and recommended by the interior department, for an extension of the public surveys in Oregon, and for increased compensation. They will provide for a survey of all lands, heavily timbered or mountain covered with dense undergrowth, at not exceeding \$13 per linear mile, for standard and meander lines; \$11 for township and section lines, and in cases of exceptional difficulty, or where a survey cannot be contracted for at these rates, the commissioner of the general land office is authorized, in his discretion, and under direction of the secretary of the interior to allow compensation for surveyors in excess of the above rates in his judgment may be necessary to insure the accurate and faithful execution of the work.
