A tremendous blast is to be made in Utah on the line of the Fort Douglas and Salt Lake railroad. The whole side of a mountain is to be blown off by one explosion, with the two-fold object of opening up a sand-stone quarry in the mountain and filling up a canyon with the debris. The pre parations have occupied many months. A tunnel 111 feet deep has been dug into the mountain, with cross cuts fiftyfive and seventy-six feet long extend-ing right and left from the inner terminus in the shape of the letter T. The height of the mountain immediately above the cross-cut is 136 feet. The blast will consist of from forty to sixty tons of powder, containing 6 per cent of nitro-glycerine, and will be exploded by electricity. Unless the side of the mountain should be blown off into the canyon by this single blast,




