

The Road to Gray's Harbor.

Tacoma, April 11. The Northern Pacific will construct and place in operation at the earliest possible day a belt line railroad extending from the coast around the point of the same Southern portion of Puget sound to some point on Hood's canal. Starting from Tacoma, the belt railroad will be constructed to Olympia in a new direct line as follows: The road would need to be extended only about twelve miles through a rich and populous country around the heads of Bell's and Lewis' rivers to a connection with the Gray's Harbor end of Skookum inlet.

The project includes the acquisition of the right of Seward and Gray's Harbor Railroads, extending from Kamilche, on Skookum inlet, to Montesano, a distance of about forty miles. The Port Blakely Mill Company, which has a mill at Port Blakely, on Gray's Harbor Railroad, has offered to sell the line to the Northern Pacific at a reasonable figure. It is reported that the Northern Pacific will take action in regard to the road the latter part of this month.

The road thus built would give the Northern Pacific an almost direct line from Tacoma to Gray's Harbor, and the construction of the road would afterwards be completed by the construction of a road from Kamilche to the canal. This would give the Northern Pacific control of the entire northern and most developing section of country extending from Tacobonam all the southern inlets of Puget Sound to the head of Hood's canal and the base of the Olympic mountains. The line would tap the head of each inlet.

It has long been known here that the Union Pacific would build into the Willamette valley, and developments would indicate that the Northern Pacific has suddenly awakened to the urgency of acting quickly to intercept its rival. The Northern Pacific now has surveyors on the ground.

The Brazilian government has proulgated decree for the liberty of the press, and liberty of association and public meeting.
