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Fishing Restrictions. Dr. Pelet, the U. S. Indian agent at Klamath Agency, intimates that promiscuous permits to fish in the reservation streams, including Spring creek, the choicest of Klamath's choice fishing grounds, will not be issued by him this season.

Local Notes. Colson is the name of the new postoffice established on Lost river, Klamath county, with E. N. Colson as Nasby in charge.

The mail service between Klamath Falls and Fort Klamath has been changed to a daily service, with contractor John G. Shallock still running it.

State Land Agent Davenport is sending to those portions of the state where unclaimed land is supposed to lie, large posters addressed "To the People of Oregon." These circulars charge the last legislature with a blunder in its failure to appropriate money for the selection of lands in lieu of the 16th and 36th sections of the forest reserve, and Mr. Davenport anticipates that within the next two years the best land now available will all be taken under homestead and timber-land acts.

General Crop Prospect. Chicago, June 3.—E. M. Thomas' crop report was issued today. Its significant features are the decrease of 1,500,000 acres in the area of winter wheat, and of 700,000 acres in that of spring, and the great deterioration in the condition of winter wheat compared with that of a year ago.

A Cherokee Scheme. A number of prominent Cherokees met at Tahlequah, E. T., recently and formed a colonization plan for such Indians as will join them in colonizing in Mexico or South America, and they are now in conference with President Diaz of Mexico, through the Mexican minister at Washington, for the purchase of the state of Sinaloa, a strip of land about 300 miles long by 100 miles wide, in western Mexico, on the coast of the California gulf.
