

NOTES AND NEWS.

The great Venetian water carnival and floral festival was in progress at Santa Cruz, Cal., all last week and attracted wide attendance from all parts of the State.

The Oregon legislature of 1935 passed a law prohibiting the marriage of a first cousin and providing a penalty therefor.

It is announced that the date for the proposed public debate upon the silver question between Hon. R. G. Horr of Michigan and W. M. Harvey has not yet been definitely settled, but it is thought the contest will take place about July 10th.

Secretary of State Kinnaird has received a letter from the Oregon State Grange, containing resolutions relative to the alleged unconstitutionality of parts of the last appropriation bill appropriating money for the support of educational and charitable institutions.

San Francisco, June 13.—Robert Gonzales, a mess boy of the lost Colima, who arrived here this morning on the Colim, in company with Fred Johnson, a sailor, gives a vivid description of the fight for life made by the helpless women and children when the ship went down.

Suits for damages aggregating \$150,000 have already been announced as about to be instituted against the Pacific Mail Steamship Company, as a result of the loss of life on the Colima.

Klamath People are Interested.

The interest taken in the proposed improvement of the wagon road between Ashland and Klamath Falls by the people of Klamath county is pretty well indicated by the stand taken by the local papers there in their last issues.

The idea is to make a good road from Ashland, the closest town of any importance on the railroad, to Klamath Falls. This is a very important and necessary improvement.

The road from Ager to Shovel Creek during much of the year is almost impassable owing to the adobe and from Shovel Creek to the state line, the road is one of the poorest in south central Oregon.

The Star man, who has heretofore spoken lightly of the effort of Rogue river valley people to improve the road from here to Klamath, has "taken a hitch in his pants" and has fallen into line, giving approval to the scheme as follows:

There are many reasons why this road should be built, prominent among which might be mentioned the fact that it will materially increase commercial relations between the people of this and adjoining counties, and the entire Rogue river valley.
