He says they are not doing this with an intention of monopolizing things, and will gladly give way to any concern which can pay the small orchardists cash for their fruit, but they have found the consignment plan very unsatisfactory on their own part and that if a big concern cannot safely consign stock a man with only a few boxes is entirely at the mercy of the commission man and it is always uncertain what he will get or when he will get it, and the Talent Orchard Company Gas Engines and Pumps will assist the small grower to a cash market till it is otherwise provided.
