**Three-Fourths of Acreage Signed**

According to a statement published by the Oregon-Utah Sugar Company, there have been 3,652 1/2 acres signed up for the growing of sugar beets for the five-year contract. The sugar company looks upon this as very satisfactory progress and expresses its indebtedness to the commercial clubs and newspapers of the valley who have assisted in the work.

All of this land is irrigated and has been passed upon by the company's soil expert. Many contracts were turned down because of clauses inserted which did not conform with the uniform form prescribed by the company.

The company announces that it will go ahead with the signing of acreage and urges all who already signed to increase their acreage and interest their neighbors. The board of directors of the company will hold its monthly meeting on December 20 and the men who have been active in the work in the valley hope to have the required five thousand acres signed by that time. At that meeting the company will decide upon its plans and make arrangements and contracts for the construction of the factory.
