Winn, recruiting officer for the third Oregon infantry, now stationed at Palm Beach, near San Diego, spent Monday in Ashland seeking recruits for the Oregon troops now in service near the Mexican border. The regiment is 600 men short of full enlistment and the opportunity is offered many young men to secure a good military training in actual service. The pay is \$13 a month and all expenses, including a \$40 outfit, and in all probability the troops will not be kept in service longer than six months.
