From there they moved to Bacon's Island, in Contra Costa county, of which Mr. Hosler was superintendent for about two years. From there they moved to Cloverdale, Cal., where they lived until the fall of 1891, moving from the latter place to the Rogue River valley, where they have lived up to the present date. Two children were born of this union—Harry Herbert Hosler, born August 2, 1875, and Earl Raymond Hosler, born April 6, 1887. Both are married and living in Ashland, Ore.
