Strickland Warns **Against Fire Risk**

The crowded condition of the stores and the increased quantity of inflammable material exposed during the Christmas season renders it important to the display man that the electrical wiring in the vicinity of his display shall be practically devoid of hazard and that the nature of his decorations and their arrangement shall be such as to reduce to a minimum the danger of fire from electrical or other causes.

In the furtherance of these objects. the display men in many of the larger cities are actively co-operating with the electrical inspectors in their effort to exclude hazardous electrical features in connection with such displays, and are eliminating the use of cotton batting and other material of a readily inflammable nature for decorative purposes.

It is now generally recognized that the careless commingling of glaring lights and inflammable merchandise # constitutes an objectionable rather than an attractive feature, and the general substitution of safer and # more pleasing modes of illumination in show windows and display rooms # is proof of the fact that there is no real conflict between the demands of safety and the aim of the displayman to exhibit his goods to the best possible advantage


