Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the city of Ashland did on the 20th day of December, 1916, after due publication of notice of hearing on the report of the Board of Viewers making special benefit assessments in Sewer District No. 18, accruing from the construction of sewer in said district, on the property within and abutting on said sewer district, approve and adopt said report, and did, by City Ordinance No. 632, levy against the several pieces and parcels of property within the said Sewer District No. 18 the assessments as set forth in said report, to be collected as provided in City Ordinance No. 347 as amended by City Ordinance No. 248.
