If these men are not to break down under the strain they must give some time each day to keeping fit.

SHOULD ORGANIZE TO PROTECT GRAIN FIELDS

The most effective means of subduing a grain field fire is through co-operative organization between the farmers and the citizens of the nearest town. Organize community fire zones embracing agricultural areas within a radius of ten miles of the nearest town or settlement. Once organized by a mass meeting of citizens and farmers, the rest is easy. Establish a code of signals and alarms. Enlist volunteer automobiles in the service. Assemble fire fighting equipment, such as water-tight barrels, old sacks, quilts, etc., at some convenient location. When the alarm is sounded equipment and volunteer fighters can be loaded into the autos and hastily transported to the scene of the fire. Every farmer should have barrels, buckets, sacks, blankets, etc., always on hand; plow always ready with doubletrees, clevis rod pin attached, and, as a precautionary measure against fires, as well as an effective means of controlling the same, he should plow

several furrows around the edges of the grain, especially along public highways and railroad rights of way and around the setting as a fire break.
