NEW HIGHWAY TO ELIMINATE ROBERTS MOUNTAIN GRADE

According to the superintendent of the road construction of the new cutoff on the Pacific highway south of Roseburg, about nine miles of the outh along the banks of the South Umpqua river to near Dillard where the road crosses the river and then re-crosses about three miles further on, and continues to Myrtel Creek, completely mountain.
