### Five-Minute Man Will Speak Tonight

H. W. Lewis, one of the men who have organized 75,000 Methodist 5-minute men in America within a few months, will speak at the First Methodist Episcopal church in Ashland this Tuesday evening at 8:00 o'clock.

Dr. Lewis is one of the notable figures in Methodism. When only a young preacher, earning \$750.00 a year, he was offered a salary of \$5,000 a year to manage a large and successful firm. Even when he was a student in college, a business man offered to finance him and divide profits.

Texas nominated him for governor but he was defeated. As a preacher, he has filled some of the best known Methodist churches in the country and everywhere commands the highest respect among business men as well as with those with whom he is associated in church work.

Dr. Lewis is one of the best all around authorities on the \$105,000,000 Methodist centenary. When speaking here, he will explain the purport of the gigantic movement to evangelize and rebuild the world.

There is no aspect of the many affecting the Methodist centenary with which Dr. Lewis is not personally concerned. While he has sometimes been styled a sensational speaker because of the fact that newspapers have often paid great attention to his sermons, yet Dr. Lewis makes an earnest, appealing figure in the pulpit.

#### CALIFORNIA PASTOR DECORATED IN WAR

Dr. Bryant C. Preston, pastor of the First Congregational church of Palo Alto, Calif., has returned from overseas where he was engaged in Y. M. C. A. work for nearly a year. Dr. Preston was decorated by the British government for his act of heroism at Withering Domes, England, when he attempted to rescue an English flight captain from a burning air craft, in which his uniform was literally burned from his back and a part of his nose torn off by an exploding shell. He was also cited for bravery on another occasion when he was badly burned in attempting to release a pilot who was strapped in a burning plane at the flying field at Bircham, England.

Dr. Preston was a former pastor of the Osage, Iowa, Congregational church with which Mr. and Mrs. N. B. Reynolds of this city were associated several years ago.
