### Explosive Souvenirs Found in Postoffice

EUGENE, Or., May 22.—A package containing a pound shell with unexploded primer and a loaded fuse on the projectile was discovered in the mail bags being sorted at the postoffice here Sunday. The parcel was addressed to a resident of Morrow, Or., and had come from a camp in France. Aside from the one-pounder a three-inch, or 75 casing, was in the package. The primer on the latter had been exploded. Postmaster E. L. Campbell withdrew the dangerous objects from the mail and is holding them here. The army officer censoring the parcel violated the order preventing the shipment of explosives thru the mails.

### Motor Trucks For Use On Highways

More than \$45,000,000 worth of motor trucks are about to be distributed by the Secretary of Agriculture thru the bureau of public roads to the state highway departments. These trucks have been declared surplus by the war department and are being distributed to the states under the provisions of Section 7 of the postoffice appropriation bill. They must be used by the states on roads constructed in whole or in part by federal aid, for which \$200,000,000 in addition to the former appropriation was given under the same bill. All that the states must do to acquire the trucks is to pay the loading and freight charges.

Of the \$9,000 motor vehicles to be acquired practically free by the states, 11,000 are new and 9,000 are used, but all are declared to be in serviceable condition. The motors will be appropriated to states only upon request of the state highway departments on the basis of the requests received from the respective states, and in accordance with the appropriation provided in the federal aid law approved in 1916. The requirements of the law are such that the bureau of public roads can not distribute any trucks to counties or individuals.
