OBSERVE "DON'T" TO PREVENT FOREST FIRES

Every precaution should be taken at this time of year to prevent forest fires, and the following "don'ts" should be posted up on every tent door flap of summer campers.

Don't throw your match away until you are sure it is out.

Don't drop cigarette or cigar butts until the glow is extinguished.

Don't knock out your pipe ashes while hot or where they will fall into dry leaves or other inflammable material.

Don't build a camp fire any larger than is absolutely necessary.

Don't leave a fire until you are sure it is out; if necessary smother it with earth or water.

Don't burn brush or refuse in or near the woods if there is any chance that the fire may spread beyond.

Don't forget that human thoughtlessness and negligence are the causes of more than half of the forest fires in this country, and that the smallest spark may start a conflagration that will result in loss of life and destruction of timber and young growth valuable not only for lumber, but for their influence in helping to prevent flood, erosion and drought.

Rural Schools Are Standardized

Five rural schools of Jackson county meet every requirement of the State Department of Education for an Oregon Standard School and are awarded beautiful engraved certificates by State Supt. J. A. Churchill.

Many other schools fall short but one or two points, and some are still working to secure a standard picture, a few desirable desks, a chair, a flag or some other necessary bit of equipment to enable them to be thus classified before the end of this school year. Those having met all the requirements of the State Board of Education for a standard school relative to the school flag, equipment and furniture, lighting, heating and ventilating, attractive school room and standard pictures, clean grounds and play apparatus, out-buildings and sanitation, library, attendance, visits of directors, and successful teacher are: Willow Springs Dist. No. 14, Miss Hazel Taylor, teacher; Lake Creek Dist. No. 19, Miss Julia Sidley, teacher; Prospect Dist. No. 59, Mrs. Irene P. Ulrich, teacher; Laurelhurst Dist. 66, Miss Hazel Ditsworth, teacher; and West Side Dist. No. 95, Miss Vertis McCredie, teacher.

One noticeable fact in connection with the schools meeting these requirements this year, is that the teachers who are at the head of these schools, all live in the districts where they teach, and some of them have taught for a number of years in the same communities.
