

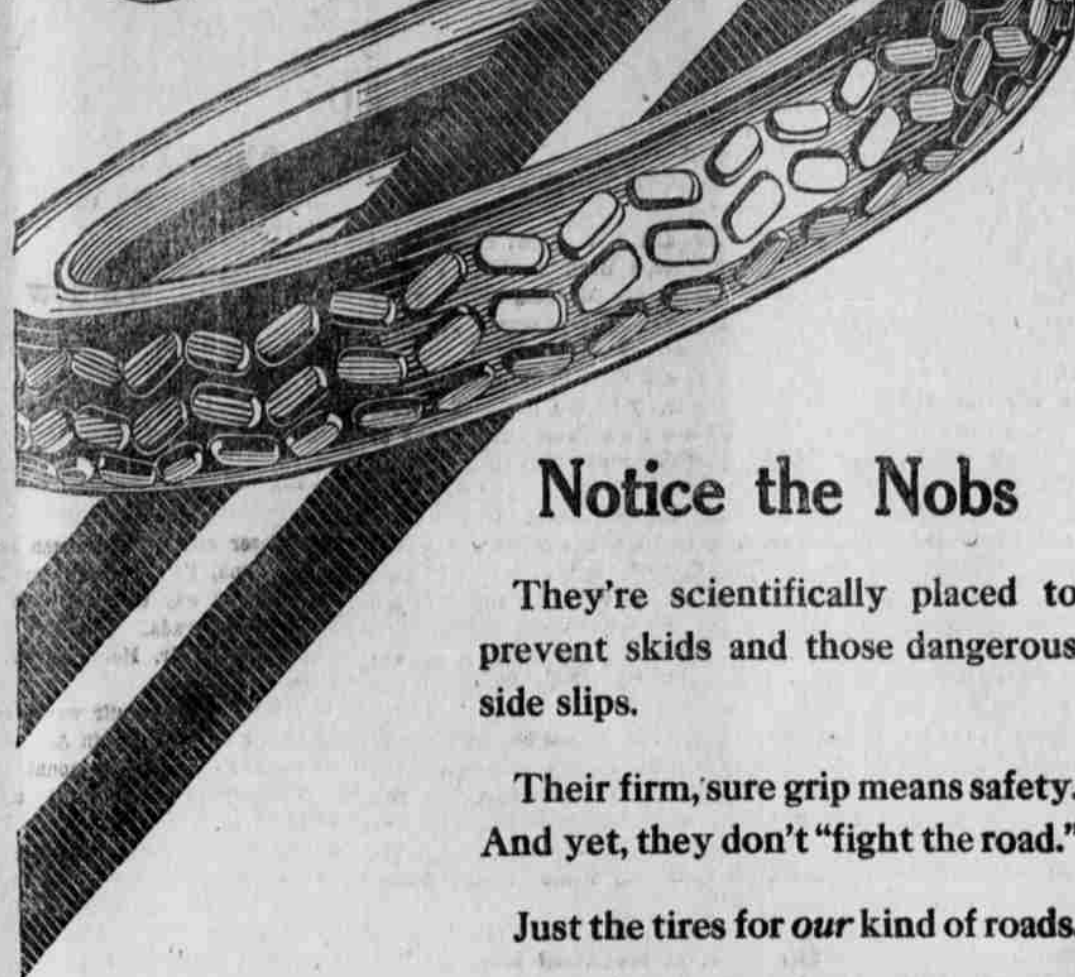

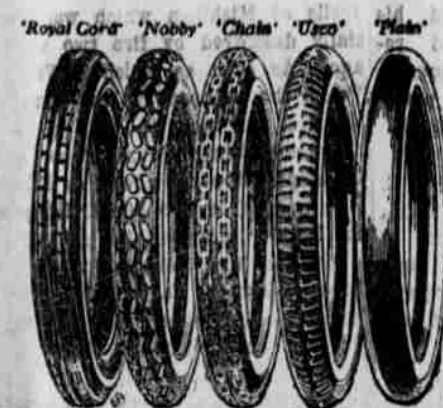

INVESTIGATING BODY

WILL MEET JULY 25

At call of Governor Olcott, issued Thursday, the committee of nine appointed to investigate the State Industrial Accident commission will meet in Salem Friday, July 25, for organization and to formulate a plan to be followed in conducting

the inquiry. The task that confronts the committee will be herculean as thousands of adjustments made by the commission must be scrutinized. The committee is empowered to employ an auditor or other assistance in making the probe and such assistance will be paid out of the accident commission funds.

YREKA ANNOYED BY

AGENTS IN UNIFORM

The Yreka News states that six men, four of them claiming to be discharged soldiers, struck Yreka last Friday and proceeded to canvass the town for magazine subscriptions, the soldiers wearing their uniforms while soliciting. As this is contrary to instructions received from the war department, City Marshal Doggett ordered them to take off their uniforms, and as a result the whole bunch left the same evening for the north whence they had come, travelling by auto.

The men who said they were discharged soldiers gave the names of Cecil Gall LeFever, Earl Livingstone, Charles A. Prince and Fred Forsburg. LeFever and Prince had their discharge papers, but the other two could not show any credentials. They claimed to be from Oregon and Washington.

It is said that employment agencies have been advertising for soldiers and offering them big pay to solicit while in uniform for magazines and papers, many of which do not exist, the sympathy game being worked to bring in large numbers of subscriptions. The war department is endeavoring to stop the practice.

SOLDIERS LAND BILL

THOUGHT SAFE IN HOUSE

In spite of organized opposition from many angles, the Mondell national soldiers' settlement bill will be reported this week by the public lands committee of the house with a recommendation that it be passed. It is believed that it will pass the house with a slight margin to spare, but the money spent to influence many of the members thru the opposition of the grange and in many of the Middle Western and Eastern states may cut the vote down to a bare majority. Some of the Republicans of the West affected by the organized propaganda against the bill are lukewarm and tried to prevent the Republican caucus making it a party measure.

Its passage insures, in the opinion of a majority of the committee, as great a development of many sections of the West as did the homestead act after the Civil war. Thousands of soldiers whose hopes for any other recognition by the government is waning, are now pinning their faith on this bill for a tangible reward for their fighting service abroad. With the passage of the bill in the house its troubles will be over, as the senate is overwhelmingly in favor of the measure and will pass it with little debate and practically no opposition.
