These facts have been repeatedly promulgated by the government's own agents and the depth of water from Portland to the sea is plainly laid down on the charts supplied to every naval vessel. No survey has every been made of the Columbia river or any of its confluents except by government engineers and out of funds appropriated by the government. Thus the government has paid for all information there is extant all it is possible for any one to know about it. Only a few weeks ago Major Fisk filed his last report with the war department, wherein he stated the use, therefore, is it for the Oregonian to multiply words about the channel's will rub out these official figures of the government. 
