There are other dangers in this life a thousand times greater than that of the railroad wreck, only we do not have them brought so forcibly to our structure. Consumption does not kill a the first time, the men begin to return for "seconds," as they call it, and are served just as plentiful again. In addition to the food cooked in the

In addition to the food cooked in the gailey the men have fresh bread morn-ling and night and hardtack at noon. The bread is issued separately to the mess tables, and the men receive it with the rest of the food. In order to keep the supply of bread equal to the de-mand there is a squad of twelve bakers on board, four of whom are at work all night. The cabin ranges are used, the bakeshop being near the cabin galley. As the ranges are in use for the cabin cooking during the day, all the baking must be done at night. The regular "straight" army flour is used, 2,400 pounds of it every day. It is baked in large biscuits, which the men call "cobs" and they eat two or three of the rate of 2,300 pounds every three of the supply construction in the set of the rest blood maker and the rate of 2,300 pounds every three of the supplied in the set is baked to the set at a meal.
