Are you with us?" ten grain-laden vessels have cleared from San Francisco this month, according to the Call, and there are but three unchartered vessels suitable to the grain trade in that port. In former years if the grain fleet of sailing vessels proved inadequate to handle the wheat yield, tramp steamers were chartered and the wheat was sent to its destination at an increased expense. This year the government has chartered all the available steamers for its transport service, and grain dealers sailing fleet, which is unable to handle the grain.

The ship British Isles, the ship Cambrian Hills and the bark Ivanhoe are the only unchartered vessels in San Francisco available for the grain NERVOUS AND trade, and there is no doubt that these will be under a charter within a few days. The Aristomene, Inverameny and Earl of Dunmore are lying in the stream, loaded with grain, unable to get away because of the scarcity of saflors. September is usually the banner month of the year for grain shipments. As a rule from thirty to forty grain laden vessels clear for Europe during that month. If all the grain vessels in port get away this month the total number will be only sixteen.

Eppinger & Co. are chartering vessels Styner, The Electric Doctor, at Puget sound and other coast poris and sending them to this city in ballast to load grain. Of course, charter prices are rising rapidly under these circumstances, and charterers are offering 36s, and 37s., while in the early part of the season 25s, or 20s, was an average price.

Grain merchants are making strenuous efforts to charter vesels and all

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
