A PECULIAR SITUATION.

Astoria Has to Send to Portland for Lumber to Build Streets and Dwellings.

"It is strange," said a well known citizen yesterday, "that the Taxpayers" League, the Chamber of Commerce and the Push Club do not get together and do comething for the town instead of holding meetings and merely 'adopting' resolutions.

What we need at present to one or ore large sawmills-we can't have too many for our timber resources are inexhaustable and the demand for Pacific const lumber was never better. A sawmill capable of cutting from one to two hundred thousand feet a day would mean much for Astoria and would give imployment to at least 190 men.

There is a good opening for more than one mill of this character, and some day some stranger will drop in and reap the benefit. It is a comm occurrence to see log rafts towed to the ents to Adams county, Ill., where she Walluski and other logging streams tributary to Astoria. The logs are sawed into lumber there and some of that identical lumber shipped back to Astoria and sold in the market.

How this can be done at a profit is more than I can explain. The cost of towing the logs to Portland-over 160 niles-is quite an item, besides other expenses, and yet the Portland mills compete in our own market with the Astoria sawmill. Our home mill must be making an enormous profit, since the wages paid the employes here are about the same as in Portland.
