

NEW YORK, Oct. 11 -- Among the letters received by Bolton Hall, temporary secretary of the American direct from Portland, Ore. League recently organized to oppose militarism in the United States, is the following from Grover Cleveland: "Buzzard's Bay, Mass., Oct. 8, 1899 --Your letter and the statements of the belief of the proposed American league have been forwarded to me. I think the statement is the best I have seen on the question of anti-expansion as it is at present exhibited to the United

"The concluding paragraphy comprises, in my opinion, the pith of the matter. The use of power for the extension of American institutions presents an inconsistency whose evil and dangerous tendency ought to be apparent to all who love those institutions and understand their motives and purposes.

"I have no objection to being among hose who subscribe to the statement. you send me. If it is sitered, however, I desire to be advised of the change before I am recorded as an advisor. "Yours truly,


