SHIPPING AND MARINE



The steamer *Mommouthshire* which has been anchored below for the past few days waiting for favorable weather left out this morning.

The Arab, a six thousand-ton steel steamer belonging to the Bedouin Steam Navigation Company, has been chartered by the Northern Pacific Steamship Company for the Portland-Orient trade. The Japanese steamship *Manyo Maru* is coming to Portland via Honolulu and a full outward cargo is awaiting her.

The German ship *Nlobe* left out yesterday.

The *Mommouthshire*, for Yokohama, crossed out yesterday.

The barkentine *Tam O'Shanter*, with a cargo of lumber for San Francisco, went out yesterday.

The German ship *Nlobe*, with wheat, put to sea yesterday.

The British bark *Crisfel*, 129 days from Antwerp is outside.

The British ship *Clackmannanshire*, 27 days from Nagasaki, is reported outside and will probably cross in today.

The British ship *St. Enoch*, 123 days from Panama for San Francisco, was spoken last Tuesday by the Post Logan. The *St. Enoch's* chronometer was broken and she signalled for her correct position.

The British ship *Port Logan* came in yesterday.

The vessel *Lock on First* (Anderson) a week ago last Sunday, but adverse winds, tides and fogs have operated to keep her beating about until yesterday.

No uneasiness has been felt here concerning her safety and at no time was she in danger, but nevertheless her delay in getting in gave an opportunity to reinsurers.
