ENGAGEMENT OF IMPORTANCE YET

The English Advance From Durban IS Being Made In Three Separate Detachments-The Boers Repulsed at Kuruman.

LONDON, Nov. 20 .- A special dispatch from Estcourt, dated Nov. 20, says a report has reached there of a battle at Ladysmith Wednesday, November 15, lasting from daybreak until 2 o'clock in the afternoon. Many boers are said to have been killed, and many are reported taken prisoners. The British losses are reported to be much less.

Another battle is said to have occurred Thursday, It is described as the heaviest yet fought. The Boers' dead, it is added, number hundreds, while the British losses were comparatively small.


