VOLUNTEERS COMING FORWARD

All England and Colorado Antelope to Enlist for the South African War.

NEW YORK, Dec. 26.—A dispatch to the World from London says: The Morning Post prints the following from its military expert:

"In the absence of news of any change in South Africa, attention at home is profitable.

"The reinforcements amount to a second army corps. Part are on the way and part are to sail. Besides the regular troops there are extra contingents from Canada, Australia, and Cape Colony, British imperial yeomanry volunteers and the imperial yeomanry.

There is to be a new corps raised by enlistment from the existing yeomanry volunteers and civilians. When it lands at Cape Town it will be in a position of a "scratch team." Time will be required for it to be in first-class trim.

"The call for volunteers has been accompanied by steps of which the wisdom can hardly be recognized. A strange thing is the city's permission to raise a special city of London corps of a thousand men, drawing the recruits from all the volunteer battalions.

"The plan now adopted is that every line battalion in the field is to be provided with a volunteer company for service and the volunteer company is to be held in waiting.

"The volunteer force is thus to be thrown into the melting pot. That may be the best use for it in the present condition and is the one Lord Wolseley has contemplated, but it is not the ideal which for many years has kept up the volunteer enthusiasm.

"Meantime ten per cent of the best volunteers will have been taken away and the defense of Great Britain will be a matter mainly of the vigilance of the admiralty."

FAVORED THE STRIKERS

Ohio Judge Says to Peaceably Induce Men to Quit Work is Legal.

TOLEDO, O., Dec. 25.—Judge Morris in the common pleas court today rendered an unusual decision as to the rights of striking workmen.

Members of the Bicycle workers' union struck at the Standard Tube and Fork side works. A temporary injunction, was granted restraining the strikers from patrolling the works and accosting and intimidating employees who took their places.

This injunction Judge Morris today dissolved, holding that the strikers had a perfect right to keep pickets about the works to talk to the workmen and urge them to come out. He held there was no positive evidence of threats and that the number of men employed at the works exceeded the number of strikers actually kept out, so there could be no danger of personal violence. The case will be appealed.
